For 12 years I commuted between Santa Cruz and Watsonville for a job with varying hours. After awhile, I no longer accepted late afternoon shifts that would leave me stuck in traffic for 45 minutes or longer. But not all workers can choose to opt out. (I have since retired)

Instead of spouting numbers and facts on transportation and reminding you of climate mandates that I am sure you are aware of, let me emphasize why I persist in trying to change the course of our transportation planning.

There are three reasons I do what I do – climate change, social justice, and a healthier and sustainable environment for everyone.

CFST's vision supports these goals.

1. Meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of the future generations to meet their own needs.
2. We acknowledge nature's limits – boundaries that can't be exceeded without damaging the health of natural ecosystems upon which all life depends.
3. Do work to reduce our community's dependency on auto travel.
4. A focus on our public transit, safe bicycles and pedestrian infrastructure rather than projects that increase auto capacity.

You may disagree with me but we have just hit a crossroad to allow us to reset our direction or get back on track with a more sustainable transportation future. The overwhelming defeat of Measure D and the setting aside of the Tier 1 HOV lane EIR gives us the opportunity to refocus our efforts to really provide Santa Cruz County with a real sustainable future transportation system.

Our twelve commissioners are the ones that are in charge and direct the process, not staff or *Caltrans*. You talk about voter mandates. The 2016 Measure D promised to get the County of Santa Cruz moving forward. So let's give the County what you promised - A superior alternative of dedicated bus on shoulder that will be a system that will last for generations. We all know that the aux lanes will fail in the future. Taxpayer's money will be wasted, household expenses will increase and it will exacerbate climate change by increasing vehicle miles traveled because the present RTC highway projects currently promote a need for more auto dependency.

An additional benefit for considering the Bus Rapid Transit scenario is a cost savings. Less money spent on Highway 1 means more money that can be directed to a rail project.

We need to revisit the business plan for the rail project and initiate the EIR study so we

can really get a handle on what amount of money will be available for the rail project.

So what is the ultimate plan I am suggesting? It is getting two transit corridors in Santa Cruz County started - Highway 1 dedicated bus on shoulder, and with money redirected, to get the rail corridor up to operational condition in order to run a Coast Futura-type transit system from Seaside Resort to the Boardwalk. This plan would relieve some congestion and give two alternate modes of transportation to our community, within a reasonable time frame.
