Santa Cruz County Friends of the Rail and Trail (FORT), a volunteer organization that has advocated and supported both the rail and trail on the Santa Cruz Branch Line Corridor for over 20 years, thanks RTC staff for bringing this item forward for the Commission's approval.

Approving the TIRCP Master Agreement allows the RTC to enter into a professional engineering and environmental services agreement with HDR for the full Project Concept Report for the Zero Emission Passenger Rail & Trail Project between the Pajero Junction and Santa Cruz along the Santa Cruz Branch Rail Line. This is a landmark step in moving forward with the rail and trail project.

There is still a portion of this work, which is unfunded: \$1.63 million. Dear Commissioners and Alternates:

We have an obligation to the people of the future as well as the present.

The voters of this county know climate change is real. We ignore this fact at our peril. Many of us realize we are presently living in the closing days of a brief period of opportunity after which course change will be enormously more difficult and painful than today. There is tremendous urgency that we act now. The risks of acting too early are miniscule when compared to the risks of failing to act early enough.

Temperatures are rising dramatically everywhere, except for coastal zones like ours.

For its climate alone, Santa Cruz County will continue to grow – both in terms of residents and visitors, even if our proximity to the San Francisco Bay area and the overheating interior valleys were not a reality. In the face of this population growth we need to also be proactive about preserving our local quality of life.

We know that cars account for a huge portion of greenhouse gas emissions.

Our country's current addiction to going everywhere by car (including electric ride-hailing and autonomous vehicles) clogs our streets and highways, denies us health-giving exercise we now seek in health clubs and contributes to our discomfort in the presence of others to whom we have not been introduced. Removing precious land space to widen existing streets and highways for more cars simply doesn't work, for "if you build it, they will come".

We need to act with concern for what life here will be like over the next fifty and even one hundred years.

In the near future, who will be coming to Santa Cruz, the San Lorenzo Valley, Capitola, Watsonville, Aptos and the North Coast? To live? To recreate? How will they get here? Where will they want to go? How will they get around?

Firm commitment to building a multi-modal transportation system with a steel spine for zeroemission light rail transit is what is required. Connecting to the light rail spine, buses, e-bike sharing, walking, ride-hailing, wheelchairs and paratransit are all components of the system we need.

This is how big infrastructure projects are built; by patient execution of a sequence of incremental steps; solving problems and removing obstacles as they arise. Literally, this is how we get there.

Today, Commissioners need to continue moving by taking the next step, which is to approve all five staff recommendations on this item regarding the master agreement and others to develop detailed plans for the continued positive evolution of transportation in our county. Plans are real; they are *actionable*. Enough of the rhetoric – let's produce the *design* and the voters will make it happen.



Dear Commissioners, Commissioner Alternates, and Staff:

We are very excited the RTC Staff is proposing to take steps forward with the TIRCP Master Agreement, ZE Passenger Rail and a rail contract. The CAPTI (Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure) clearly identifies rail and a future integrated state rail network as a priority of the state. Electric rail is the most energy efficient and least environmentally destructive form of transportation to move large numbers of people ever invented. Our Santa Cruz Coastal Rail Branchline can be found in the California Transportation Commission/ DOT's plans to be a functioning passenger rail within 10 years. We support the SCCRTC in aligning with environmentally wise transportation policies and actions and well as respecting the voting majority in this county and the State of California in prioritizing ZE passenger rail for our community.

The community has been active participants alongside the RTC with respect to developing passenger service on the Santa Cruz Branchline for over two decades, prior to its purchase and through the years and myriad of steps and studies. The RTC's approval of the Trans Corridor Alternative Analysis (TCAA) identifying electric passenger rail as the preferred choice for our passenger rail service in February 2021. Studies and surveys as well as the nearly 74% opposition to Greenway's ballot Measure D show consistent, ongoing, vigorous public majority support for passenger rail and a trail along the Santa Cruz Branchline.
