Subject: STATUS REPORTS ON TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT

(TDA) REVENUES FROM DECEMBER 2023 AND JANUARY 2024

SUMMARY:

Transportation Development Act revenues are received monthly from the State of California Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA). Attachment 1 provides the Commission with the status of revenue receipts through January in comparison to estimated revenue in dollars and as a percentage.

Transportation Development Act revenues were projected to increase \$297,381 (+2.48%) from \$11,955,278 in FY022-23 to \$12,252,659 in FY2023-24. FY2023-24 Transportation Development Act cash receipts for July 2023 through January 2024 are \$50,330 (-0.41%) lower at \$7,269,061 compared to the \$7,319,391 FY2023-24 budget estimate. FY2023-24 Transportation Development Act cash receipts for July 2023 through January 2024 are \$115,441 (-1.61%) lower at \$7,269,061 compared to \$7,153,621 FY2022-23 actual receipts.

Staff are meeting with Hinderliter de Llamas on February 15, 2024, to review quarter 1 results including the sales tax trends, actual sales by industry group, and revised projections for FY2023-24. Staff will provide the Commission with an update in March.

BACKGROUND:

Funding for the Transportation Development Act (TDA) funding is derived from a quarter-cent (¼ cent) of the general sales tax collected statewide.

The Transportation Development Act funds improvements to existing public transportation services. Revenues are dedicated to public transit, paratransit for seniors and people with disabilities, and bike and pedestrian projects.

As the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for Santa Cruz County, the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission is responsible for receiving and managing funds, processing Transportation Development Act apportionments, and making project approval decisions guided by the Regional Transportation Commission's Rules and Regulations.

On April 6, 2023, the Commission adopted the FY2023-24 Budget and Work Program including the Transportation Development Act revenue apportionments to the transit agencies, cities, and county as shown in table 1.

2023 AND JANUARY 2024

SUMMARY:

Measure D revenues are received monthly from the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) and distributed to the direct recipients. Attachment 1 provides the Commission with the status of cumulative revenue receipts in comparison to the prior fiscal year revenue in dollars and as a percentage.

Measure D revenues were projected to decrease \$248,892 (-0.9%) from \$27,363,250 in FY022-23 to \$27,114,358 in FY2023-24.

Staff are meeting with Hinderliter de Llamas on February 15, 2024, to review quarter 1 results including the sales tax trends, actual sales by industry group, revised projections for FY2023-24. Staff will provide the Commission with an update in March.

BACKGROUND:

On November 8, 2016, Santa Cruz County voters approved Measure D, a half-percent transaction and use tax (half-cent sales tax) dedicated to transportation projects and services. Measure D provides critical funding to advance and implement priority transportation projects throughout Santa Cruz County. The state began collecting the new 30-year, half-cent (½ cent) sales tax for local transportation improvements in April 2017.

On June 16, 2016, the Commission passed and adopted Ordinance 2016-01 enacting a retail transactions and use tax known as the "Santa Cruz County Transportation Plan Measure" (Measure D), establishing the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission as the "Authority" responsible for administering the Ordinance consistent with the Expenditure Plan.

On November 2, 2023, the Commission approved an amendment to the FY2023-24 Measure D Budget adopted on April 6, 2023. The FY2023-24 Measure D Budget revenue allocations are shown in table 1.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff recommends that the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) receive a report generated by Caltrans on their active projects within Santa Cruz County.

BACKGROUND

Caltrans provides a project update report listing all active project locations, brief description, construction timeline, cost, assigned project manager, construction contractor (as applicable) and comments with updates to the Commission for each RTC meeting.

DISCUSSION

The February 1, 2024, Caltrans report includes updates on projects in construction and under development. Changes since the last project update are shown in bold-face font. Each project location is listed by route and postmile, which can be found using the Caltrans postmile services website query tool: postmile.dot.ca.gov. The types of projects range from storm damage repairs, pavement preservation, drainage upgrades, bridge rehabilitation or replacement, and safety upgrades.
